It was great to see so many animal themed costumes. A grand total of £255.60 amount was raised.






























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## **Year 6 Seafront Activity Day**

## **Tag Rugby**

On Monday afternoon a Year 4 and Year 5/6 team headed to Wootton to take part in the Jason Robinson Foundation tag rugby tournament. This was a great opportunity for the children to meet a world champion rugby player and play lots of games. Although the Year 4 team lacked experience, they listened well to the coaching points given during each game and made great progress winning their final games. The Year 5/6 team was a mix of experienced Year 6 and some less experienced Year 5 players. All players stepped up and had to quickly learn the discipline and self control required in rugby. The team pulled together and were unbeaten in their matches. All players left with a medal and the Year 5/6 team were presented with a winners trophy. Well done both teams









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## **Basketball**

On Wednesday 21st May, a team of children from Year 6 travelled to Southampton Solent University to take part in the Hampshire Basketball Finals, along with 15 other qualifying schools.

The schools were split between two halls to compete in the group stages. Our team faced seven games against some very tough competition. We finished the morning with four wins and three losses - an excellent achievement. At this point everyone went off for lunch and a well earned break.

After lunch, all of the schools were called back into the main hall to hear the results of the groups. We placed fourth in our group, putting us in the top tier of the play offs for the afternoon. This was an even higher level of intensity and we had to really dig deep for these matches.

We had three games; the first two we lost by a small margin of goals and the third we won with a result of 7-4.

This meant we came seventh overall, not only out of the 15 schools competing on the day but out of the whole of Hampshire. This is a huge achievement for our children and for Queensgate as a whole. Our team on the day; Brooke, Ellie, Halle, Sophia, Artem, Denys, Jonny and Lucas stepped up in all areas. They showed, resilience, hard work and impeccable behaviour throughout the day.

Lastly a special mention to the rest of the team who we were unable to take to the mainland; Harry, Tom, Evie and Hayley.

## **Queensgate Out & About**

On Tuesday morning, our Reception Out and About group had the chance to ride the train. The children have been learning about different types of transport so were super excited to catch the train from Ryde Esplanade to Brading. They were all very sensible waiting on the platform and loved travelling up and down the pier (over the sea!), going under the ground through a tunnel and under bridges.













The children in Year 3 are continuing their topic on rivers. This week our Out and About children walked along the River Medina, from Seaclose towards Shide. The children made comparisons between the Western Yar and the River Medina, noting the concrete banks, how the river flows under Coppins Bridge and the industrial surroundings.













On Wednesday morning, the Year 1 Out and About team went to visit St Catherine's Lighthouse, in Niton (in readiness for next half-term's topic). The children enjoyed learning about the history of the lighthouse, looking at the octagonal shape of the tower and counting how many seconds between the flashes of light. The group continued walking along the coastline to Watershoot Bay, where they were lucky enough to see two seals playing in the bay!











Our Year 2 Out and About group went on an adventure around Firestone Copse, on Wednesday afternoon. The children had fun identifying different leaves and trees using their leaf ID charts. They discussed which trees are evergreen and which are deciduous. The children were all keen to find a good walking stick and liked finding dens within the woodland. They were all polite and well-mannered when speaking to members of the public, out walking their dogs, a credit to the school- Well done!




