Staying Safe Online

Google Family Link connects your Android or iPhone to your child's Android phone or tablet to help you set and tailor certain digital ground rules that work for your family. These features include:

- **Manage the apps your child can use:** approve or block the apps your child wants to download from the Google Play Store
- **Keep an eye on screen time:** see how much time your child spends on their favourite apps with weekly or monthly activity reports. You can also set daily screen time limits for their device
- **Set device bedtime**
- **See your child's device location**
- **Remotely lock their device when it's time to play, study or sleep.**

Attendance Information from the Isle of Wight Council

What to do if your child is unwell

Most schools will have an attendance policy which is aligned to the expectations and guidance of the Isle of Wight local authority, including the specific procedures a parent/carer should follow in the event of their child needing to be absent from school. Parents/carers are advised to refer to the school's own procedures alongside this guidance.

As a parent/carer you should notify the school on the first day your child is unable to attend due to illness. Generally this is done by telephone and many schools now have an answerphone facility specifically for this purpose. Schools should authorise absences, unless in very rare cases when they have cause for concern about the genuineness of an illness. If this is in doubt, schools can request that medical evidence is provided, such as a prescription or an appointment card; a note from a doctor may not be necessary. Schools can record the absence as unauthorised if they are not satisfied that the illness is genuine but should advise parents/carers if they intend to do so.

You should let the school know:

- the nature of the illness (although you may wish to talk confidentially about this)
- whether your child has seen their GP, or whether an appointment has been made for some other specialist service
- how long you expect your child to be absent from school
- the prognosis for the child's recovery.

For absences that are expected to last up to 15 school days and that are not part of a pattern of a recurring illness, the parents/carers should discuss with the school whether they are willing to organise for work and homework to be set as soon as the child is able to cope with it. The school should also agree with you how completed work will be collected, marked and returned.

Longer absence through illness, injury or medical condition

If absence is long-term or repeated, schools may request proof that your child is genuinely unwell and unable to attend school as this is a key part of their safeguarding duties. Keep copies of any appointment letters or medical reports.

If your child:

- has a long term or chronic condition, and is expected to be absent from school for a longer period
- has intermittent attendance due to an illness (such as epilepsy or sickle cell anaemia)
- is going to be absent from school for a period of therapy or surgery

The school may want to draw up a support plan with you, and consider whether to refer your child to our specialist services.

Education for pupils who are unable to attend school because of medical needs can be provided for in the following ways:

- children who are in-patients of most hospitals will be taught through the in hospital teaching service
- children who are not in-patients, may receive home tutoring organised via the Education Inclusion Service and a local education centre

Children who are admitted to NHS hospitals (including psychiatric units) in other areas will receive education through local hospitals, schools or an education centre.

In the corridor leading down to the dining hall, Mrs Cade, updates the league table on a weekly basis. The children all decided on class names - some are based on books and some are based on the teacher's names (Hunter's Heroes and Tilling's Tigers!) and some are just random names!

The children often look to see where their class is on the league table. The winning class each week receives the attendance trophy - a magnificent and impressive gold one!



Out & About

The RSD Out and About team visited the Isle of Wight Donkey Sanctuary, in Wroxall, on Tuesday morning. The children have been exploring the topic of *Animals* this half term so extended their learning to find out more about donkeys and ponies. They had a tour of the farm where they met the 117 donkeys, 15 ponies and one mule that live at the sanctuary. The children found out about what they eat, how they are cared for and why the donkeys were rescued. They all had the opportunity to meet Whizzy, one of the miniature donkeys to give him a gentle stroke. The children were amazed at how soft the donkeys were, especially their long ears. They all fell in love with Kitchi, one of the youngest- but tallest- donkeys at the sanctuary! The team of staff and volunteers would like to pass on their thanks to our Reception parents and carers for the kind donations they have made this half term which will go to provide food and care for the donkeys.



As part of their Science work, the children in Year 1 will be learning about animals next half term. **1CE** had a very special visit to the Isle of Wight Deer Farm on Wednesday to begin their topic. The Deer Farm is home to over 200 Wapiti, Red and Fallow deer that live within 334 acres of land. Although the deer are raised for venison, the farm aims to give the animals a natural and relaxed environment, without human contact, just like they would experience in the wild. As part of their walking tour, the children had to be extremely calm and quiet so as not to scare the deer. Juan, the farmer, explained to the children how deer can hear, see and smell things within a 4-5km radius! He also told the children that deer are ungulates (a type of hoofed animal), that have shorter front legs and longer back legs. The children enjoyed watching the female Wapiti deer climb the field in formation, all with their noses held high checking the group out. At the end of the tour, the children learnt about antlers and how they fall off once a year and then re-grow. They were able to handle and compare the antlers from different breeds of deer.



Yet again, staff were amazed by the determination and effort all of our Year 3 and Year 5 swimming children this week. We are so impressed with their attitude to improve and make progress!

- 2 Ensure you, or someone you refer to us, has working smoke alarms
- 3 Fit carbon monoxide detectors where needed
- 4 Help put together a household escape plan and identify any mobility issues that may impede an evacuation
- 5 Issue fire retardant bedding, furniture throws and nightwear where needed
- 6 Give basic advice on topics such as falls prevention and smoking
