Out & About

On Tuesday morning the **RAB** Out and About group began their topic on Transport with a ride on the electric train. The children enjoyed watching the hovercraft hover into Ryde and then caught the train from Ryde Esplanade to Brading station. They thought it was great fun going underground through the tunnels, under bridges, meeting the conductor, looking at the changing scenery out of the windows and changing platforms. The children listened to some facts from non-fiction books about trains as well as sharing some stories about *The Little Red Train* by Benedict Blathwayt whilst they had snack and waited for the return train. All of the children were superbly behaved and incredibly sensible.



Our **Year 5** children will be learning about Space this term. The Out and About team visited Bonchurch on Tuesday afternoon to follow the Space Trail along the seafront towards Ventnor. The children took it in turns to read facts about each planet and compared their relative distance from the sun. They also explored the comparable size of each planet using a variety of sports balls.



The children in **Year 4** are going to be learning about wind power and renewable energy this term within Science. To tie into their new topic, the Out and About group visited Bembridge Windmill on Wednesday morning. The children had a go at doodling the windmill using pen, tried timed drawings and had fun trying to not take their pen off the paper! The children learnt about the history of the windmill and how it began providing flour to the local community over 300 years ago. After a bit of drawing time, the group used their map reading skills to navigate their way towards Whitecliff Bay and then back to the minibus.



On Wednesday afternoon the first Out and About team from **6TM** went Geocaching. The children hunted for caches along the old railway line at Merstone and surrounding farmland. They used the Geocaching app on their phones to follow maps, decipher hints and clues, then navigate to find different caches. The children worked really well as a team to find all six in the area, writing in the log-book at each one they found. Well done team!

Did you know?

What used to be known as 'school refusal' refers to when a child's anxiety reaches a level where they can't go to school.

It's now called Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA) because 'school refusal' makes it sound like the child's choice not to attend. This is 'within child deficit' - which means assuming it is the child/young person who needs to change or be 'fixed' rather than their environment.

1 Exploring reasons

There are lots of possible reasons for a child's level of anxiety to build to the point that they don't feel able to go to school. These might be to do with the school environment - perhaps it's related to SEND, or social problems in school. Or, it might be because of family breakdown, or bereavement.

Sometimes the child can't express why they are anxious. Rather than ask 'what's wrong?', Young Minds recommend drawing an 'anxiety iceberg' with them. Here's a video explaining how: <https://youtu.be/s5l-qvDmJ9I>

2 Tailored plan



A meeting between a member of staff from the school, the child and a parent can help to begin form a plan of what can be adapted to reduce some of the anxiety.

The stress hormone cortisol is often higher in the morning (to help get us out of bed!), however this can make feelings of anxiety worse in the mornings. It can therefore be helpful to focus on morning routines to start with - maybe arriving 10 minutes early to do a 'job' or chat with a mentor. This also provides them with a 'safe space' in the school.

3 Build on strengths

It can be helpful to normalise anxiety and let children (and parents) know that school is a demanding place, so lots of people feel anxious from time to time.

Work with the young person's strengths and areas of interest and resilience - point out past successes and positive relationships. Then build these things into a support plan. For example, if a young person has had past success in Maths, [art of the plan might be the initially coming in for these lessons and building from there.

Look out for brilliant bee themed activities this May in partnership with the Bumblebee Conservation Trust!

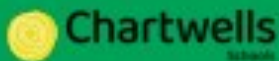
