So, you know what is going on in the last two weeks of term!

Here is a rundown of what is going on in school over the next two weeks.

Sunday 8th December

The Queensgate choir will be singing at St James' Church at 4:00pm. The children need to arrive at 3:30pm please and be in full school uniform with long hair plaited – looking their best for the performance. It would be lovely to see you there – the more the merrier!

Tuesday 10th December

There are PTFA discos after school on Tuesday. Here are the times for the discos:

Thursday 19th December

Party Day - The children can wear their own clothes. Please make sure they are suitable for a school day.

Interspersed with these dates we will be carrying out Progress Meetings where the senior leaders of the school will discuss the progress of every child in the school and be making plans for the Spring term.

Queensgate Out & About

Our **Year 2** Out and about group had the opportunity to visit Bembridge Airport on Tuesday morning, in readiness for their next topic on Flight. The children learnt about how pilots communicate with air traffic control on the ground, different features of aeroplanes (bi-planes and monoplanes) and the key parts of a plane (ailerons, elevators, tail, rudder, wings, propellers). The children were allowed to sit in a real plane and explore the controls, learning how a plane would be flown. The group got to watch a 1930s Tiger Moth take off from the airport and see a small monoplane land too.

"We went to Bembridge Airport. My favourite bit was when I went inside the wind sock! I did like sitting in the plane but we didn't take off!" Evelyn 2KA

"I liked looking at the planes. I really like the one we got to sit in. I sat in the pilot's seat and steered to make the ailerons on the wing move. We got to see a Tiger Moth fly!" Rudy 2KA







On Tuesday afternoon, our **Year 5** children followed a trail across the Causeway at St Helens and around the Duver. They followed the clues and used their compasses to guide them. The children found where they were on an OS map and practised working out the six-figure grid reference for different locations.




Fencing
