Staffing News and Arrangements for the Summer Term

As you know I am leaving Queensgate on Friday 4th April at the end of term. I am going to work for the Isle of Wight Local Authority as the School Improvement Team Leader. I will still, very much, be involved in education. My role will involve helping all schools to improve their standards and outcomes for children.

Friday 4th April is going to be a very busy day!


We start the day with an Attendance and awards assembly.



Last week, Emma from the Wildheart Animal Sanctuary came to visit our Reception and Year 1 children. She taught them all about white-tailed eagles.


The children learnt about their claws, white tails, pointy beaks, what they like to eat, where they live and Emma even showed them how big their wingspan is!
