Dear Families,

High Expectations

We have one overarching aim this academic year and that is to raise attainment. We are absolutely committed, as a team, to raise attainment for all children. Our beliefs as adults can affect children through things we say and the behaviours we exhibit. I would like to invite you to express positive beliefs to your children about what they can achieve both at school and in life in general. Our fluency strand is working on pace and being able to automatically be able to do tasks. Please join us in supporting the youngest children with their fluency in phonics – this will directly impact their reading. Please hear your child read every day. This will help their fluency in reading. In Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children continue to use Kinetic letters to help support them with their fluency in handwriting. If children learn to read and write fluently in the younger years it means they are in a better place when they get into Key Stage 2 to tackle the curriculum with confidence. Age Related Expectations (ARE)

Here are links to end of year expectations for all year groups. These are the main things they will be learning in reading, writing and maths between now and July. I thought it would be useful for you to have them, so that you know what we are aiming for and you can support them with their learning journey at home. If you have any questions please let one of us know and we can see if we can help you. Year 1; Year 2; Year 3; Year 4; Year 5; Year 6;

Multiplication Tables

Learning times tables is so important as it underpins so much of the maths curriculum. Here are the expectations for each year group:

Year 1 Count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10, recall and use doubles of all numbers to 10 and corresponding halves.

Year 2 Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Year 3 Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

Year 4 Recall and use multiplication and division facts for all multiplication times tables up to 12×12 .

Year 5 Revision of all times tables and division facts up to 12 x 12

Year 6 Revision of all times tables and division facts up to 12 x 12

Therefore, we would expect children in Year 4 to know all their times tables and division facts up to 12 x 12 and they will be tested on this through a National online screen based test. Please do work with your children around learning their times tables and division facts. Thank you.

Assessment Information for Parents

Primary school pupils in England take part in the:

- reception baseline assessment: within the first six weeks of entering Reception
- early years foundation stage profile assessment: between April and June of the academic year in which they turn five (usually the reception year)
- phonics screening check: in June of Year 1
- key stage 1 tests: optional, at the school's discretion, at the end of Year 2
- multiplication tables check: in June of Year 4
- key stage 2 tests (sometimes referred to as SATs): in May of Year 6

Eco Tips!


Energy conservation is one of the most important things we can all do to reduce our carbon footprint.






