Better Attendance means Better Attainment


Dear Families,


As you know we encourage good attendance at Queensgate. I have been looking at our attendance data. This year we are running at 94.7%. National attendance is at 94.8. This is 0.1% better than ours. One area we do less well in is with our persistent absentees. If your child's attendance is below 90% they are labelled as Persistently Absent (PA). Over a full year this would be in excess of 20 days – that is four weeks or a whole month off school. Absence at this level could cause considerable damage to the child's educational prospects and extreme risk of under achievement. Notably research shows that good attendance promotes positive mental health and resilience as wel as academic ability.

• Pupils with higher attainment at KS2 and KS4 had lower levels of absence over the key stage compared to those with lower attainment.

Working Together for a Successful Future


- Pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths in 2019 had an overall absence rate of 4.7% over the key stage, compared with 3.5% among pupils who achieved the expected standard and 2.7% among those who achieved the higher standard.
- Pupils who did not achieve grade 9 to 4 in English and maths GCSEs in 2019 had an overall absence rate of 8.8% over the key stage, compared with 5.2% among pupils who achieved a grade 4 and 3.7% among pupils who achieved grade 9 to 5 in both English and maths.
- Generally, the higher the percentage of sessions missed across the key stage at KS2 and KS4, the lower the level of attainment at the end of the key stage.
 - Among pupils with no missed sessions over KS2, 83.9% achieved the expected standard compared to 40.2% of pupils who were persistently absent.
 - Among pupils with no missed sessions over KS4, 83.7% achieved grades 9 to 4 in English and maths compared to 35.6% of pupils who were persistently absent.

Parking outside Queensgate


On a Tuesday and a Wednesday, we have children attending swimming lessons and the coach full of children gets back at about 3:15pm. Week after week the swimming bus cannot pull up at the Bus Parking space outside the school, forcing the coach into the road, so children disembark into the road. This is not acceptable. Please refrain from parking in this space.

"The blue badge is not a licence to park anywhere. Like other road users, you must obey the rules of the road, as laid out in the Highway Code. Blue Badge holders cannot park on pedestrian crossings (Zebra, pelican, toucan and puffin crossings) including areas marked by zig-zag lines."
